PVA's 2022 Policy Priorities

We recently released PVA's veterans and disability policy priorities for 2022. Our priorities reflect the need for paralyzed veterans to have access to high-quality, comprehensive health care and timely, accurate delivery of all earned benefits. They must also have equity of access to the opportunities and freedoms available to all Americans. The list of priorities for this year are as follows:

- ·Protect Access to VA's Specialized Health Care Services (System Access, Staffing, and Infrastructure)
- ·Expand Access to VA Long-Term Services and Supports (Facility-Based Long-Term Care and Home and Community-Based Services and Caregiver Supports)
- ·Improve VA Health Care Services and Benefits for Catastrophically Disabled Veterans and their Survivors (Assisted Reproductive Technologies, Survivor Benefits, Adapted Automobile Benefits, and Home Modification Grants)
- ·Increase Access to VA Health Care and Benefits for Women Veterans with SCI/D
- ·Protect the Civil Rights of People with Disabilities (Access to Air Travel and Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Compliance)
- ·Strengthen and Enhance Social Security Benefits
- ·Increase Employment Prospects for Veterans with Disabilities

National PVA's Veterans Career Program Update

PVA VETERANS CAREER PROGRAM UPDATE

Angela Curry's household was changing. For the past 20 years Angela had been substitute teaching — a career choice that allowed her the flexibility to be there for her husband, U.S. Army Veteran Preston Curry, and their daughter, when they needed her.

But life was moving forward. PVA's Veterans Career Program recently helped Preston find a job he loves with the Virginia Department of Veterans Services. He is settling in nicely with his new career helping other Veterans, and is active with sports in his free time. The couple's daughter is now grown and off beginning a life of her own after college

Angela, who holds a Bachelor's degree in both criminal justice and English thought, "This is a time for me to do

Since her husband had worked with VCP, she knew the program helped spouses as well, so she reached out to explore her education and career options with Alex Spangler, a PVA Vocational Rehabilitation Counselor.

"I wanted to tap into my criminal justice degree, but I'm so out of the loop because I graduated back in 2000, Angela said. "I just needed to be current."

Alex helped Angela update her resume, and introduced her to online courses and job sites. After a few weeks of training through Linkedin Learning, Angela realized the online platform wasn't a good fit for her. She wanted to look into going back to school to brush up on her computer skills and to obtain a certificate in paralegal es – but she was worried about the cost. Alex helped her research local community colleges and tuition assistance programs.

Alex put her in touch with John Tyler Community College and the Virginia Military Survivors and Dependents Education Program (VMSDEP). Angela applied for, and was approved, for a 100% tuition waiver, and will only be financially responsible for the

Angela says PVA's Veterans Career Program was very helpful with the educational resources she needed to build upon her two bachelor's degrees and change

"I hadn't done a resume in 20 years. Alex helped me with that," she says. "VCP helped me tap into lots of job sites, and take updated computer classes for the specific job that I'm looking for. And it also turned me on to LinkedIn Learning, where you can take courses and get certificates, which you can add to your

Angela is eagerly preparing to go back to school and plans to work with Alex when it is time to start looking for paralegal work. Alex and the Veterans Career Program stand at the ready to find Angela the perfect career fit, just as they did her husband. Alex says, "Angela and I will continue to work together to ensure her success."

To best serve our Veterans in our SCI Outpatient Clinic – we ask for your assistance with following mandates regarding masking and visitors:

Masking and Visitor Requirements:

All patients and VA employees are mandated to wear a mask at all times while on the Palo Alto campus. If you refuse to wear a mask you will not be seen. There are no exceptions. For appointments where Veterans need to be transferred from wheelchair to gurney by nursing staff (CT, MRI etc.) – please call and schedule an RN-TRANSFER Appointment at least 2 weeks in advance. **Scheduling x65871**

DEFENDER'S LODGE

Defender's Lodge is available for Veteran's who live over 50 miles from the hospital – Consults can be placed only 3-4 days prior, must provide evidence of either a negative COVID test within 72 hours prior to checking-in or be fully vaccinated (2 weeks past last vaccine in series). Failure to do so will result in your not being able to stay at the Defender's Lodge. **Social Work x65340**
