

National PVA's Washington Update

Joint Senate Hearing Examines Transition Process

On October 18, the Senate Armed Services and Veterans' Affairs Committees held a joint hearing to examine military to civilian transition processes. Much of the three-hour hearing focused on the Transition Assistance Program (TAP) which is run jointly by the VA, the Department of Defense, and the Department of Labor. Witnesses included representatives from all three agencies, the Government Accountability Office, and a small group of veterans' advocates.

A broad range of subjects were touched on during the question and answer portion of the hearing such as the availability of mental health care during the transition process, the interoperability of electronic health records between DOD and VA, and ways to get service members to start thinking about their civilian life earlier in their military careers. There was also discussion around DOD ensuring that transitioning service members are able to enroll in TAP courses at least a year out from the date of their separation.

One subject that came up during both witness panels was the need to fully integrate accredited veterans service organization representatives into the TAP process. The importance of veterans having assistance from an accredited representation cannot be overstated. PVA's accredited Service Officers specialize in providing services for veterans and service members who are severely injured or suffer disabling diseases. These services are free of charge and are offered from the time of disability to end of life.

Improving the transitioning of families, with emphasis on taking better care of spouses, is another area that drew considerable attention. DOD has a number of programs to help military spouses with employment while the service member is actively serving, but offers little assistance to them when the military member transitions back to civilian life. The hearing was recorded and you can watch a video of it here.

PVA VETERANS CAREER PROGRAM UPDATE

EXPLORING SELF-EMPLOYMENT



According to a report by the National Disability Institute, 74% of people with disabilities do not participate in the labor force; and turn to self-employment and small business development as a viable alternative to traditional employment.

Thanks to a generous grant donation by the Wells Fargo Foundation, VCP launched a

pilot program (February 2023) to provide training, counseling and access to capital to veterans with spinal-cord injury or disease (SCI/D) who are considering self-employment.

Howard Cleland is an enlisted Army veteran with a 100% service-connected disability rating. Howard originally contacted the Veterans Career Program in January 2023. He had questions about how starting a small business would affect his SSDI benefits. He had been working at starting a gunsmith business and had many questions about licensing and registering such a business. Our Vocational Rehabilitation Counselor, Jim Arndt, and Howard also discussed the SSA Ticket to Work program to assist Howard with returning to work without immediately losing his SSDI benefits.


The same day that they talked, Howard was sent (by the Wisconsin PVA chapter) information about the disabled veterans self-employment pilot program. He applied for the program and was accepted. After 8 weeks, Howard pitched his business self to a panel of business professionals, and was one of two PVA members to receive a \$2,500 subgrant to test start his business - Grouchy-Ole Mans LLC.

After completing multiple requirements and registrations, Howard was able to launch his business on September 11, 2023. He has expressed appreciation for the depth and direction of the Veterans Career Program's small business training. "In eight weeks, I learned probably two years' worth of education just in three hours a week for the eight weeks. Our instructor was informative. He provided everything we needed to pretty much exceed anything you want to know to start a business. I couldn't be any more grateful to PVA for hosting this class."

2023 Women Veterans Empowerment Retreat (WVER)



Women Veterans make up 1.8 million of the U.S. population, of which roughly 10 percent are disabled and enrolled with the Department of Veterans Affairs. They are the fastest growing Veteran population, yet many of these women often feel

forgotten and pushed aside while trying to navigate a system that wasn't designed to address their unique healthcare needs. They also feel isolated not only from the entire Veteran population, but from each other. PVA's Women Veterans Empowerment Retreat (WVER) is an all-expenses-paid retreat that focuses on the holistic well-being of women veterans with disabilities. VCPs Vocational Rehabilitation Counselor, Danielle Hetu, helped plan and facilitate this year's WVER and had this to say:

Earlier this month, I attended the PVA women veteran empowerment retreat in Orlando, I had the great honor of meeting one of my clients, Tracey Cooper-Harris and her wife, Maggie Cooper-Harris for the first time, in person. Tracey, our event keynote speaker and an incredibly fierce advocate for veterans, really kicked off the event with her story of strength, resilience, and determination. Over the course of the event, I had the great privilege of meeting other remarkable veteran women PVA members who were passionate, resilient, making new connections, and so ready to take the information back home. I have absolutely no doubt that we will be seeing and hearing more from these amazing women in the future, and it was truly an honor to not only contribute to the event, but to also personally connect with these remarkable women.
