National PVA's Washington Update

DOT Releases Proposed Rule to Improve the Air Travel Experience of Wheelchair Users

The Department of Transportation (DOT) has published a notice of proposed rulemaking on ensuring safe accommodations for wheelchair users in air travel. The proposed rule is based in large part on PVA's February 2022 DOT petition to initiate rulemaking authority, as well as follow up letters on the topic. The changes proposed by DOT include several vital steps that would dramatically improve the air travel experience for people with disabilities. Specifically, they would clarify airlines' obligations and responsibilities to individuals with disabilities; better enforce violations and administrative penalties onto airlines that mishandle assistive devices; and improve airline processes for returning, repairing, and replacing mishandled wheelchairs, to include informing wheelchair users about the location of their device during transit and allowing them to choose their own repair company, if their wheelchair or scooter is damaged. The changes would also mandate critical hands-on training on a regular basis to any airline staff or contractors who physically assist passengers with mobility disabilities or handle battery-powered assistive devices. PVA will be submitting comments in response to the proposal.

Upcoming Veterans' Committee Activities

On March 6, 2024 at 10 a.m. ET, PVA National President Robert Thomas will testify about PVA's 2024 public policy priorities before a joint session of the House and Senate Veterans' Affairs Committee. MAKING THE TRANSITION



Whether you've been a veteran for 10 years (or more) or planning your transition from the military, our Veterans Career Program counselors can help you with your career goals. Dwight Kirkpatrick is a retired Army Master Sergeant and service-connected disabled veteran.

During his transition from military service, he began creating his resume and searching for a new career. He spoke to people in his network about resources and advisors to help him navigate through the civilian employment process. After being referred to the PVA Veterans Career Program by a friend, Dwight was introduced to Employment Analyst, Rodney Lee, for employment assistance.

Dwight and Rodney began working together shortly before Dwight's military retirement in October 2023, and they searched and explored employment options and opportunities. They also explored resume development, networking opportunities, and interview skills and techniques. After reviewing positions with several companies, Dwight found Bank of America's military development program to be a unique opportunity to learn, grow, and lead within the financial operations business

The military development program SVP for Bank of America reviewed Dwight's resume and invited him to interview. Dwight studied for his performance and prepared for his interaction through mock interview practice sessions. He completed three interviews with the bank over the course of two months and would later receive a congratulations call for being hired as the Assistant Vice President of Global Operations.
