ELECTION PROCEDURES

NOMINATIONS:

Nominations shall be opened at the regular meeting of the Board of Director's held during the month of January in the year of elections. Nominees shall submit a nomination package. The nomination package shall include 1) a letter of intent to run for an office or as a Director; 2) certification of membership eligibility form; and 3) a brief biography. A nominee may not seek more than one position during any single election year.

- 1) <u>Letter of Intent:</u> The letter of intent shall include the nominee's name, address, telephone number, and the position to which the nominee seeks to be elected.
- 2) <u>Certification of Membership Eligibility Form:</u> This form shall be completed and submitted with:
 - a) Proof of citizenship (birth certificate, passport, immigration and naturalization form, or voter's registration form);
 - b) b) Proof of active duty service in the Armed Forces of the United States or our Allies which is terminated by discharge or separation under conditions other than dishonorable (DD 214); and
 - c) Medical proof of spinal cord injury/disease (medical records or physician's statement).

NOTE: Requests for certification of membership must be received in the Chapter office prior to the closing of nominations. Members not certified at the time that ballots are mailed to the membership will not have their names placed on the ballot.

3) <u>Biography:</u> The biography shall be no more than 250 words. The biography shall be printed along with the ballot and submitted to the membership for consideration. The purpose of the biography is to allow the nominee an opportunity to inform the membership as to the reason (s) that he or she is the most qualified person for the position being sought. (Photos of the nominees shall not be permitted to accompany the biography.)

The nominations shall be closed during the regular Board of Director's meeting held during the month of March in the year of elections.

National Service Officer Report

Welcome to the new year of 2025. Let's start the new year with a new car, truck, or van. The laws have changed, and you may be able to get a new vehicle at a very low price to you. I would like to discuss the changes



to the Eligibility for adaptive automobiles and adaptive equipment. There are some good changes to the Auto Grant and some bad ones to the adaptive equipment that started on October 1, 2024. Let's begin with eligibility. Veterans can apply for a VA automobile grant every 10 years under the Advancing Uniform Transportation Opportunities (AUTO) for Veterans Act of 2023. This rule takes effect in 2033. The workaround right now is if your last grant is 30 years or older, you are eligible for your second grant now. If your 30 years come before 2032, you are eligible at that time. If you are under 30 but over 10 years old, you must wait till 2033 for your second grant. I can help you file this VA form 21-4502 for the auto grant. The new granted value for 2025 is \$26,417.20 toward your chosen automobile's base price. Before buying a vehicle, you need this grant; the VA will not reimburse you for any expenses.

The second part of the grant is for adaptive equipment needed to make the vehicle safe to drive or ride in. You will need your primary Doctor to request a driver's evaluation. Here is where you get the VA form 10-1394 application for adaptive equipment-motor vehicle filled out. This form helps pay for the equipment or have the equipment fixed at the VA expense at the new VA equipment value. Here is where the new law in October comes into effect. The VA set forth a federal limit on the value of the equipment. In most states, this is a fair price. However, in some states like California, Hawaii, and Alaska, The price value will no longer cover the full value of the equipment. Here is a link to see the value of the equipment you may need. https://www.prosthetics.va.gov/psas/AAE_Schedule.asp. Here is an example of the new price that may affect you: The federal in-shop Hourly Labor Rate is \$127; this may not meet California's labor rate of \$175 an hour.

This is still new to the VA and Prosthetics departments at the Palo Alto SCI Center. Currently, you should still be able to get a fully accessible vehicle for around \$85,000 minus the \$26,417.20 grant and the \$50,000 equipment, leaving the buyer only \$8,582.80 to pay or finance. I understand that this may be confusing. Please don't hesitate to call either the Palo Alto office or the Sacramento office, and we can do our best to explain this process in detail. MAJOR VICTORY! CONGRESS PASSES ELIZABETH DOLE LEGISLATION

On December 16, Congress finally passed the Senator Elizabeth Dole 21st Century Veterans Health-care and Benefits Improvement Act (H.R. 8371/ANS to S. 141). This legislation addressed some of the biggest legislative priorities for PVA, like eliminating the cap on the amount VA can pay for care in the home; increasing access to home and community-based services, like Veteran Directed Care; and strengthening supports for caregivers.

Other PVA-endorsed provisions in the bill allow veterans' survivors to retain their eligibility for education benefits and create a pilot program for the VA to furnish assisted living services for certain veterans in rural areas. Barring anything unforeseen, the package should be on the President's desk before the year is over. PVA has worked tirelessly over the past few years to get these critical, life-changing provisions signed into law. We look forward to working with the Administration on implementation.

ANOTHER MAJOR VICTORY! DOT RELEASES PROPOSED RULE TO IMPROVE THE AIR TRAVEL EXPERIENCE OF WHEELCHAIR USERS

On December 16, the Department of Transportation (DOT) released a final rule on ensuring safe accommodations for wheelchair users in air travel. The final rule resulted, in part, from PVA's February 2022 DOT petition to initiate rulemaking, as well as follow up letters on the topic. The new requirements, many of which go into effect in January, will dramatically improve the air travel experience for people with disabilities. Specifically, they clarify airlines' obligations and responsibilities to individuals with disabilities; better enforce violations and administrative penalties onto airlines that mishandle assistive devices; and improve airline processes for returning, repairing, and replacing mishandled wheelchairs, to include informing wheelchair users about the location of their device during transit and allowing them to choose their own repair company, if their wheelchair or scooter is damaged. The changes also mandate critical hands-on training on an annual basis to any airline staff or contractors who physically assist passengers with mobility disabilities or handle battery-powered assistive devices.

PVA's comments on DOT's proposed rule were extensively referenced in the discussion language accompanying the final regulation. These changes represent the culmination of a multi-year effort spearheaded by PVA to improve the safety and dignity of wheelchair users in air travel. Masking remains <u>required</u> for anyone with any type of respiratory symptoms/cough or diagnosed with COVID-19, Flu.
